Our aircraft is a North American SNJ-4 advanced trainer of the type known as the "Texan." These aircraft were flown by all military services during World War II.

The SNJ-4 was used by all pilots prior to going into high performance aircraft. Its engine is a Pratt & Whitney Wasp 9 cylinder radial, air cooled, with 600 HP.

The date December 6, 1941, is stamped on the engine name plate, the day before the infamous attack on Pearl Harbor by the Japanese on December 7, 1941.

This aircraft is a national treasure.

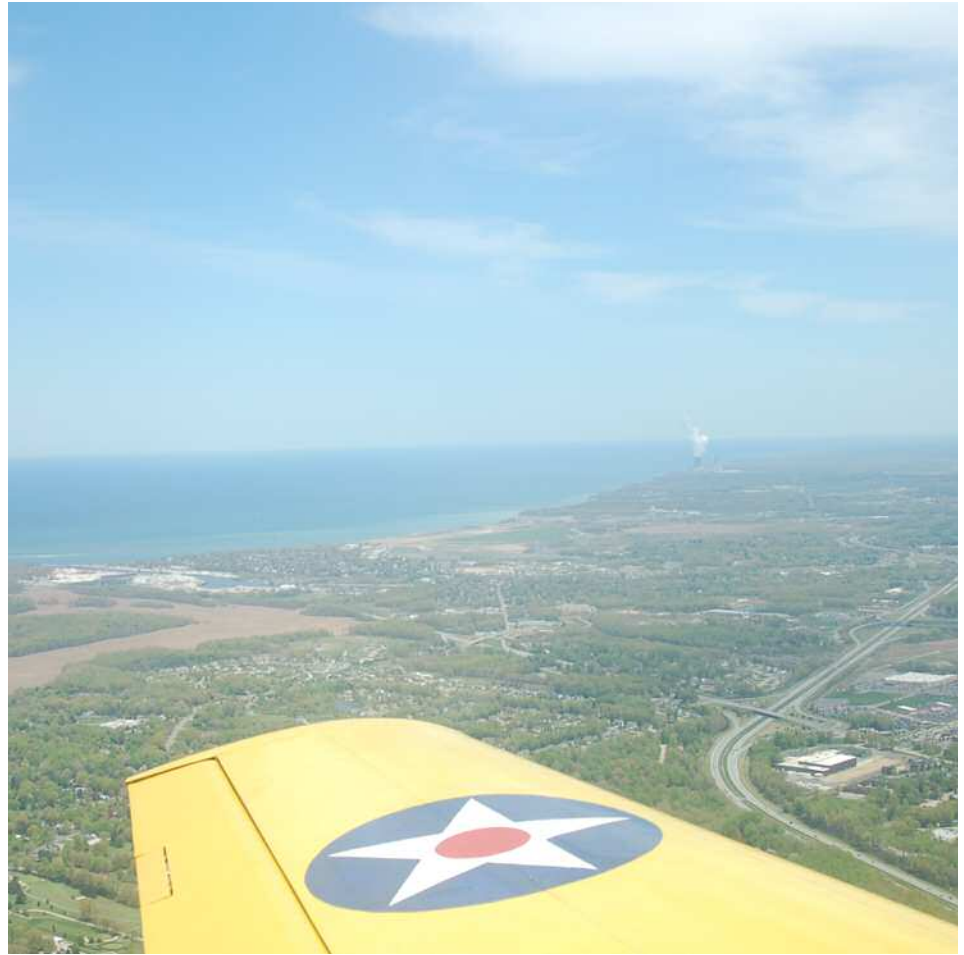
supporting functions come from member dues, contributions, aircraft and special sponsorships, and the American Airpower Heritage Foundation. No government grants are received.

1. To preserve, in flying condition, a complete collection of combat aircraft which were flown by all military services of the United States Air Force in World War II.
2. To provide museum buildings for permanent protection and display of these aircraft as a tribute to the thousands of men and women who built, serviced and flew them.
3. To perpetuate the spirit in which these great planes were flown in defense of our nation.
4. To establish an organization having the dedication, enthusiasm and esprit de corps necessary to operate, maintain and preserve these aircraft as symbols of our military aviation heritage.



You May Apply for Membership as a Colonel in the Cleveland Wing of the CAF

The most important requisite for CAF membership is a sincere interest in the preservation of WWII combat aircraft and the stories they tell. You must also be 18 years of age or older. You need not be a military veteran, just have a love of aviation; especially of World War II aircraft. The CAF is made up of men and women from all walks of life, and all trades and professions, who come from all 50 states and many foreign countries. Each candidate, when accepted, is commissioned at the grade of Colonel.
